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Summary & Objectives

I am a Professor of English with specialization in TESOL and ELT. Have taught English in various programs home and overseas for more than forty years. After completion of my first Honors degree in English and then my first Masters in English Literature with components of American Literature, I received some in-service educational training under the auspices of the British Council and the USIS. Later as a Fulbright scholar, on successful completion of pre-academic ALIGU courses at Georgetown University, Washington DC, I obtained my Masters with specialization in TESOL from Temple University, USA. Also completed an Advanced PG Certificate Course in TEFL at Ohio University, USA. I did my PhD in an interdisciplinary field of language, intercultural communication, spoken genre and acculturation at Victoria University, Melbourne, Australia in 2009.

My participation as a Fulbright scholar in the US and later as a research fellow in Australia has been a major breakthrough in my professional career. While the western education has enabled me to acquire the graduate skills like business acumen, teamwork, leadership, problem solving, working independently and calmly in crisis, the practical experience of teaching and other academic engagements in the western and non-western educational landscapes have made me aware of institutional standards like code of conducts, pre planning including setting goals, strategies for achievement, and cultural sensibility.

I have taught English in its various programs to different professional groups and postgraduate courses in (Applied) Linguistics, ELT and translation studies, Bengali (to foreigners) in Bangladesh and overseas. I have also taught courses in *Culture and Communication*, and *Problem Based Learning (PBL)* and *ESL* and edited theses of Aus Aid grantees and at Victoria University, Melbourne, Australia.

Besides teaching, I have been involved in four UNDP Bangladesh and EU supported projects as consultant-cum-vendor and provided services that included editing, translating various reports in both Bengali and English, compilation of the Codes of Ethics of Lawyers of the Bar Council of Bangladesh, and preparation of training module for the judicial staff. Have also trained for SAT test designed for UN Peace Keeping Missions. I have also been an adjunct faculty at different (non)govt. and corporate training institutes. My involvement with UNDP Bangladesh and EU has provided me with a high standard of professionalism compatible with the world bodies.

I worked as a medical interpreter Melbourne between 2003 and 2008, and also with the visiting Canadian research team. The texts that I usually translate and edit range from official letters to Govt. policies, travelogue, legal documents and parliamentary acts.

I have been a certified examiner of several internationally recognized English language proficiency tests (e.g. **DELNA, ACCESS, IELTS,**) since 1995.

Recently I have retired from the service of Dhaka University, and have worked for a private university in Dhaka.
