### Brief bio

Md. Obaidul Haque has been teaching at the Department of International Relations in the University of Dhaka since 1998, currently as Associate Professor. After completion of his masters in Forced Migration from the University of Oxford in the UK, he worked as Ford Fellow at the Program in Arms Control, Disarmament and International Security in the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign, USA, and studied Conflict Prognosis & Transformation at INCORE in the University of Ulster, Northern Ireland. He takes interest in the areas of non-traditional security issues in the borderlands of Bangladesh-Myanmar and Bangladesh-Northeast India. He is also interested in the shifting geopolitical and geo economic dynamics of South Asia including the Bay of Bengal in the context of an increasing competition between India and China in recent times. One of his core research areas is the dynamics of post conflict societies with particular focus on the Chittagong Hill Tracts region in Bangladesh. In his leisure Obaidul Haque is an avid birdwatcher and a passionate wildlife photographer.
