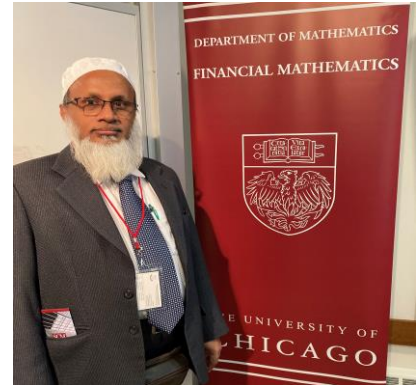

In his research one of his findings is that sophisticated investors, mutual fund managers, and hedge fund managers, who have superior analytical ability in stock selection and follow optimal asset allocation techniques, also must pay close attention to IS (Implementation Shortfall) which is pertinent especially for short-term traders (or day traders) and dynamic traders because these traders engage in trading quite frequently in a short period of time. The study can be highly useful for the small traders of the US market. The trader in developing country like India, Japan, China, and Bangladesh can also take advantage from the study.
